A New System For All Drivers: Club Class



On the surface nothing is wrong with ladies classes, but as we examine the data and its place in greater context we should consider a change, one that recruits and supports women drivers without isolation, and serves us all.

Negatives of Ladies Class

- Autocross is one of the few motorsports that still separates women into a 'Ladies Class'
- Exclusionary to the broad membership of competitors
- Limits women's mentoring, support and data sharing from diverse and top drivers
- Will never "fade away on their own" due to contingencies paid out to women only
- Forces a choice by gender and cosigns exclusivity
- Contributes to the narrative that women aren't as good and need special classes
- Leads to women feeling they must "qualify" to run Open
- Causes "Poaching" from Open

• Creates unrealistic expectations of winning and ill prepares for combined competition

Helps with logistics such as childcare, car

- Data shows a tiny fraction of women win most contingencies
- Created in the 70's, not current with progress and societal growth
- Ladies class participation is diminishing
- Causes men to "solicit" women drivers to win contingencies for them
- Restricts women's potential
- Segregation that creates conflict between drivers, limits competition, isolates the women in Open
- Indexed ladies classes results in women "cleaning off the course" 1st Heat
- Trends show women are leaving for Open
- "Funneling" to Ladies class via expectation, peer pressure

Positives of Ladies Class

- Contingency
- Class choices (open or ladies)
- Mentoring from women
- Helps keep up membership numbers and allows more drivers to participate
